NAPLAN

Congratulations to all of our Year 3 and Year 5 students and the staff who were involved in these tests. The positive engagement and great behaviour of the students was exceptional. These tests provide a "snapshot" of how individual students are tracking in their development of their literacy and numeracy skills. The results inform teachers about where support is required to enhance learning, and therefore inform teacher programs. This year is the last time our school will do the test in the written format as in 2022 we will move to online delivery. Parents will receive their child's results when they are delivered to our school in a few months' time.

Drop off and Pick Up

The council parking rangers have been out and about over the last fortnight. Please ensure you are parking in the correct spot when you are dropping off and picking up your children to avoid a fine. I understand that parking can cause frustration at times. However, please remember that your interactions with other parents are being observed by our community and your children.

Shield Street Gates

During the day our Shield Street Gate remains closed. We understand that for some families this may cause issues if you have to collect your child early or are running late. However, our staff cannot leave the office to open the gates as this leaves our phones and the sick bay unattended. In addition, when you collect children from school early they need to be signed out through our computer system. We appreciate your patience and understanding if you are refused entry through the back gate during school hours.

I often talk to the students about having high expectations and how wearing school uniform offers them a sense of belonging. It symbolises that they are part of our amazing little team. Marayong Heights is a great school, full of great kids in a great community. 
From the Deputy Principal



New Pedestrian Gate

In case you missed reading our previous newsletter, a new electronic pedestrian gate has been installed at the front of our school on Guerie Street to ensure the safety of our school community. This gate will automatically close at 9:10am each morning and again at 3:15pm. Students and visitors arriving between these times, will need to press the buzzer to receive entry into the school. If you are outside of the school gate, an intercom will call in the office, allowing our office ladies to open the gate from their desk. There is also a buzzer inside the gate on the brick wall at the bottom of the stairs that will need to be pressed to allow the gate to open for exit from the school grounds.

We finished our day with a walk around the Zoo, looking at all the animals and then met the buses to go back to school. We were so exhausted, so many of us fell asleep on the bus ride home!


playground used to be. Obviously depending on our fundraising, determines the length of this project. We are hoping to complete this in stages. Updates to follow.
